In the Graduate School First Semester Doctoral Program, based on the students' level of proficiency at the undergraduate level, we aim to train students to acquire methods for comprehensively understanding, comprehending, and solving research problems, and to foster expert professionals who can respond to the demands of society in all its various aspects. In the Graduate School Second Semester Doctoral Program, students further refine the specialized skills they developed in the first semester, with the aim being not only to achieve systematic research results, but also to cultivate them into expert professionals and researchers capable of contributing to society.
